



Jesus as Savior – Week 4

Personal Devotional

Sermon Title: Where Salvation Leads

Theme: Jesus saves us into ongoing life with Him—living connected, transformed, and sustained by His presence.

WORSHIP – Settling Into Life With Jesus

Begin by slowing down. Take a few deep breaths. Put some worship music on.

Remind yourself: You are not here to perform or prove anything. You are here to be with Jesus.

Reflection:

- 1 Do you experience your relationship with Jesus more as closeness or obligation?
- 2 Are there areas where you feel pressure to perform spiritually?
- 3 What helps you feel most connected to God right now?

Don't try to change anything yet. Simply notice.

Worshipful Truth: Jesus didn't save you at a distance—He saved you into life with Him.

Thank Jesus for desiring closeness, not mere compliance. Sit quietly for a moment in His presence.

WORD – Life Sustained in Christ

Read (NIV) and slowly reflect on these passages:

- 1 John 15:1–8 – Remaining connected to the true vine
- 2 Romans 8:10–11 – Life given by the Spirit now
- 3 Romans 8:29 – Being formed into the likeness of Christ

As you read, notice:

- 1 Jesus invites you to remain, not strive
- 2 Life flows from connection before fruit appears
- 3 Transformation is God's work as you stay close

Reflect:

- 1 What stands out to you about how Jesus describes life with Him?
- 2 Where might God be inviting you into deeper connection rather than greater effort?
- 3 How does knowing God is forming you over time bring comfort or hope?

Core Gospel Truth: Salvation does not end with forgiveness—it unfolds as life shared with Jesus.

PRAYER – Living From Connection, Not Pressure

Confession

Jesus, I confess that I often relate to You through effort instead of intimacy.

Pause and listen for the Spirit's gentle response.

Receiving Prayer

Jesus, thank You that You are my life, not just my Savior. Teach me to remain connected to You—to live from closeness rather than striving. Form Your life in me as I walk with You.

Surrender

Jesus, I entrust my growth, my obedience, and my future to You. Help me live today aware of Your presence and dependent on Your life.

You were justified, reconciled, made alive—and now you are invited to remain. This is where salvation leads: life with Jesus.
